Over the past nine years, they have devoted their time, talents, and efforts to stopping the gun violence the plagues not only the city of Chicago, but our entire nation. Walking valiantly into their tenth year, BRAVE continues to do whatever is necessary to ensure the safety of their fellow Chicagoans.

BRAVE accepts youth as young as six years old into their program as "Baby BRAVE", which then expands to "Junior BRAVE" for youth up to age 12, and "BRAVE" which involves youth in high school and college. This year, BRAVE has almost 50 participants across their three councils. They recognize the vital role young people play in advocating for change in our community and fostering their growth.

They focus their weekly teaching on four major areas: peer-to-peer support, public speaking, leadership, and activism. These behind-the-scenes lessons are integral in preparing them for creating outward change events like the End-Of-School March, Shutting Down the Dan Ryan, town hall meetings and more.
